The Aggregate of whose superficial Area, according to its various forms is nine Hundred Eighty Six Acres Abutting, limited and Bounded South Westerly with the Sea Shore at the Old Road West Northerly with the Lands of M^r Henry Garbstant, whence it is separated by a Line running from the Low water mark N. E. 18.00 Thirty four Chains to Merifields Gut next Merifields Lands and East Southerly with the said Old River next the Lands & Plantation of Charles Matthews Esqr. Surveyed April 10 1782 by M. Lord Rogers & Copied & reduced from his Plan. February 20 1819
